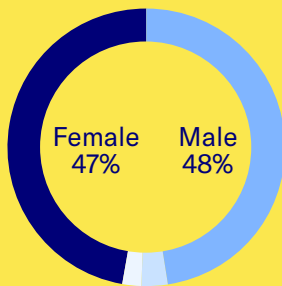

(All Sites)

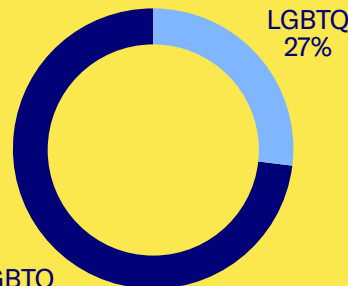


Gender Non-Conforming 2%

(U.S. & Canada)

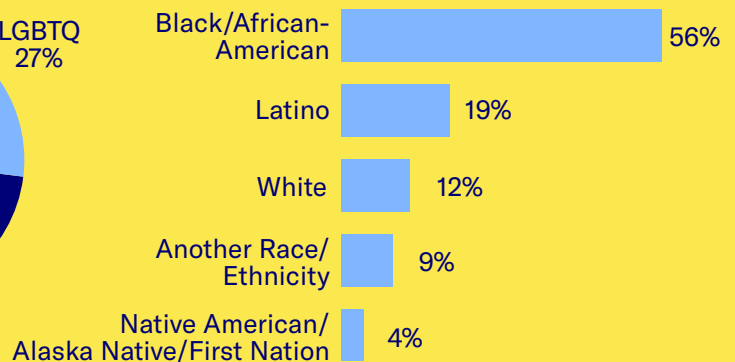


Non-LGBTQ 73%
